

## **Back to School Bond Update**

Just a few weeks out from the start of the school year for our traditional calendar students, you will notice some major changes at a couple of our schools.

First, the open classroom renovation project at Schickler Elementary is drawing to a close. The west wing of the building will be ready to rock for the first day of school, with traditional and secure classrooms.



In addition, major work is being done

at the CFI-West Campus to prepare roughly half of the facility for demolition. Our local employees may have already noticed the removal of the awnings from the building and the prep work for the initial stages of the south parking lot expansion.

"This is an exciting time for us, as we see some long-overdue projects begin to take shape," said LCS Superintendent Matt Wandrie. "We know many people are eager to see all the work come to completion, but we have to be patient as we move through our project timeline."

## Sally Hogan's class at Schickler Elementary helps beautify birthplace of author Marguerite DeAngeli


Thanks to the efforts of Sally Hogan's third-grade class at Schickler Elementary, a new sign is now on display at the birthplace of Lapeer's own Marguerite DeAngeli. Mrs. Hogan's third grade class sold enough pickles to raise money to restore the Marguerite DeAngeli sign at Oregon and Main Street.

There will also be new landscaping to beautify the space around the home.

During her life, she wrote and illustrated 28 of her own books, and illustrated more than three dozen books, numerous magazine stories and articles for other authors.

This project started when Sally's class read *Copper-Toed Boots* by Marguerite DeAngeli. The books were donated by Lapeer's Rotary Club to each third grade student this past year.

DeAngeli's childhood years in Lapeer were recalled as happy, and when Copper-Toed Boots was published in 1938, local adults and children alike delighted in the telling of what Lapeer life was like for a kid — in this case DeAngeli's father, Shad Lofft — growing up here in the 1800s. Those stories are still inspiring kids here, and in return, those kids are making sure the mark DeAngeli left on this little town is not forgotten.



"I'm so proud of my students for their work with community members to restore the landmark sign," she said.

# Safety Tips for Schools From the LCS Operations Department

- Any fire door that is designated to normally be kept closed (equipped with a self-closing mechanism) must not be blocked open with a chair or doorstop.
- Student-prepared artwork and teaching materials may be attached directly to the walls and must not exceed 20 percent of wall areas.
- Do not stack or store any item less than 18 inches below sprinkler heads deflectors in sprinklered areas of the building.
- A clear and unobstructed path for egress must be maintained in the hallways, in and around exit doors and in vestibules, to allow for proper egress in the event of an emergency. If tables and/or chairs are temporarily utilized in the hallways, all items should be placed to one side and removed when the task is completed.
- Heaters/radiators in the classrooms should remain free of combustibles such as books, papers and craft items. These units should also NOT be blocked by items so quick access is available.
- All electrical panels should have a clearance of three feet of any items to ensure the panel is quickly accessible.

## **Eliminate Excess in Buildings**

As we keep safety and energy efficiency as priorities in the operations of our buildings, please note that the following personal/residential items should not be brought into classrooms:

- Residential furniture
- Space heaters/fans
- Microwaves/coffee makers/refrigerators/grills
- Additional lighting unless lighting is necessary for learning environment
- Rugs/carpet that were not purchased from commercially approved resources
- Bookcases/shelving units that were not purchased from commercially approved
- resources
- Drapes/curtains/fabric that were not purchased from and installed by commercially
- approved resources
- Hot plates
- Scent warmers/candles
- Paints/chemicals/cleaners




